



The Senate has given final legislative approval to the SEBAC agreement that executes our collective bargaining agreement with UConn Health (tally pictured above, courtesy CT-N). The House approved it the day before.

A few implementation steps and signatures and such need to take place over the next several weeks, and we don't have a definitive timeline yet, but we can say, we've cleared all the major hurdles and see a path to receiving our retroactive raises and lump sum payments toward the end of June. After a Year and a Half, We Have a Contract!

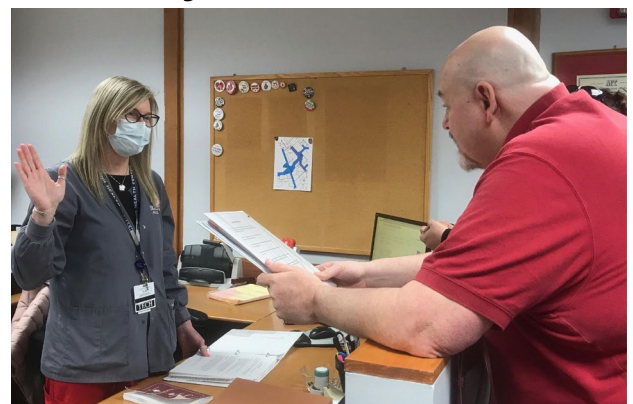
I'm keeping it brief because we have so much to cover this month.

All six UConn Health nurses receiving this year's Nightingale Awards for Excellence in Nursing are UHP members, chosen from a record 25 nominees. Congratulations!



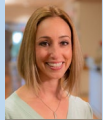
