## **Election '18: It Is Time**

There's no other way to say it. It's time to get ready to vote.

To be clear, voting is an individual choice. And UHP does not endorse or financially back any candidates.

All we can do is encourage you to understand what's at stake Nov. 6 and cast an informed vote. Our Meet the Candidates Breakfast Oct. 2 was one example of this. Here are others:

- We are in tune with AFT CT's process to vet and rate candidates based on their likelihood to represent the interests of working people.
- We send delegates to AFT and AFL-CIO conventions to have a voice in and get a better understanding of the political landscape as it relates to the future of the labor movement.
- We offer the list of candidates endorsed by AFT CT (bit.ly/AFTCTendorsed18 and the CT AFL-CIO (bit.ly/CTAFLCIOendorsed18).
- We have officers and members who take part in labor walks and other activities to support the campaigns of endorsed candidates. Get the details at bit.ly/1809walks.
- We share information through all available channels to reinforce the idea that whom we elect can have a great impact on the rights and benefits the labor movement secured for us and future generations - if we are willing to fight to protect those rights and benefits.

The rights of all working people are under attack, and the labor movement is on the front lines. We are the soldiers enlisted to defend this cause. Our best chance at success is to stand together, use our collective strength, and make ourselves heard, especially at the ballot box.

### Important Choices

There is so much going on this time of year: fall festivals, Yankees and Red Sox going at it again, college and pro football, election season, campaigning, meet and greet, labor walks - every day, something to do. Much has happened already this season, and so much more to come.

I invite you to look up the candidates' positions on state employees, on pensions, on paid sick time, and on SEBAC.

For those ARP members who are eligible to switch to the SERS or Hybrid plan, we are now in the window to switch you have until mid-December to make this one-time irrevocable decision. Talk to a financial counselor/planner, see what makes the best sense for you and your family's future. Then get your paperwork in order and get it in. There will be no additional timelines on this. No grace periods. If you miss it, you will continue in the ARP plan you are currently in. Which is still a good plan, but this is a choice, your choice.

One final note, one we don't get to hear enough: "Thank you for all you do."


We get the elected leaders we deserve. We can be participants or spectators.
