It's election time again! Members shortly will receive the call for nominations. This is an opportunity for members in good standing to be nominated for positions that will be open July 1, 2019. This year we are

electing the following officer positions:

- VP Tier I (must be a Tier I employee)
- VP Tier II (must be a Tier II employee)
- VP for Community Outreach
- Chief Steward (must be a steward with super seniority)

There will also be a handful of opportunities for more union involvement by members who might be interested in becoming a delegate to various conventions and councils. Delegate nominations this year will be for:

- AFT-CT Convention
- CT State AFL-CIO Convention
- CT AFT Executive Council
- Eastern CT Area Labor Fed. (Eastern CT ALF)
- Greater Bristol Labor Federation (GBLF)
- Greater Hartford Labor Coalition (GHLC)

Nominations for both officers and delegates must be turned into the UHP office by the close of the first business day in February, which will be **4** p.m. Friday, Feb. 1, 2019.
