The 2019 legislative session is over, and we did some great things this year!

We decided to really work together with the other six unions at UConn Health. We opened up our Wednesday informational table and invited the other unions to join us to have one-on-one conversations with members. We had many people from our partner unions come to our table. While UHP has a strong presence here at UConn Health, it was great seeing the other unions working with us in our walls. It was a great success. And we are going to build on it. We'll continue doing UConn Health Labor Coalition tables once a month, and invite our allies to join us.

We shared information and resources like we hadn't before. We worked to keep all parties informed and on message. We fought to keep UConn Health a **Public Hospital for the Public Good**. We fought for more coverage of our unfunded liabilities. We had people start by sending emails to legislators, then ramped it up to phone calls, and then we went to the Capitol. AAUP, 1199, and UHP all shared a speaking spotlight. We were surrounded by the legislators, we had the microphone, and they listened to us. This year's budget they added \$33.2 million dollars to cover a large part of that unfunded liability.

Labor's voice was heard at the Capitol. We were there. We did this! Thank you all for everything you did, and all you do.
