### **CT Election Day Notes** Labor 2024

#### AFT CT Mailings

- > 3,600 "persuasion" pieces to 10 priority races
- > 20,100 get out the vote pieces
- > 8,100 handwritten postcards to mailers

Our endorsed federal and state candidates had an 81% win rate – 39 of them were union or former members (87% win rate), and 8 were AFT CT members (100% win rate).

The results in CT bucked national trends;

Democrats now have a super (veto-proof) majority in both the Senate (25-11) and the House (101-50).
