We will soon begin meetings between your union's negotiating team and UConn Health's human resources and management teams.



Your team consists of myself as chief negotiator, Shawn Brown as 1st VP of collective bargaining, Bill Garrity as president, and many other volunteer members, representing the wide range of occupations and worksites in UHP.

Typically, bargaining can take many months — it is important not only that we "get it right" when it comes to issues of language and pay, but also to ensure that the only public hospital in the state is able to operate well with professional, unionized staff serving as its backbone for years to come. We are prepared to stay at the table as long as it takes, and will have a better sense of the timeframe for this negotiation once a few sessions have taken place.

What is needed from each of you reading this newsletter is a commitment to staying informed and engaged with your union, especially now, and being willing to express your commitment, whether that takes the form of proudly wearing a union button, or submitting written testimony at the state legislature (don't worry, we can help you).
